4. Focus on what matters to you


Look for a group that shares your values and gives you a sense of belonging.


5. Don't feel pressured

IFC FACTS

1. Basics of Recruitment

- 9 IFC fraternities
- Average Range of dues:
 - IFC New Member dues range from \$250–\$650, averaging \$470
 - IFC Active Member dues range from \$375–\$1320, averaging \$550

2. IFC Academic Information

- Spring 2025 IFC GPA: 3.31; cumulative GPA: 3.32 (compared to institutional men's averages of 3.29 and 3.30). Use the QR code to view the full report card.



- Fraternities raised \$36,597 for national and local philanthropies.
- The entire week is substance-free. No chapter may host an event where alcohol, drugs, or tobacco is present.
- Potential members are expected to abstain from the consumption of alcohol and/or any substance use during the week of Primary Recruitment.
- Additionally, fraternities are not permitted to say anything negative about the other fraternities on campus. If you see this happening, please report it to the IFC. It should be a telling sign that if they do not have enough good things to say about their own fraternity and have to start talking poorly about others.
- Finally, women who are part of a sorority affiliated with Panhellenic Council are not allowed to participate in men's recruitment in any way.



Recruitment begins on 9/5. Open events will mostly be held 9/5–9/9.


- These events are hosted by each chapter individually. It is recommended that you attend as many as possible. Each chapter determines the format of its events.





Invitation Events: 9/10 and 9/11

- It is common practice that fraternities hold two days each week to extend invitations to potential new members. This is not required and will be announced by each fraternity.
 - Fraternities are individually responsible for distributing invitations in whatever manner they choose. They will report to IFC whom they have invited, but it is their responsibility to inform you when and where the event is held.
 - These events tend to be more formal, focused on values and the specifics of membership.
- 

Bid Day: 9/12

- Fraternities can extend bids no later than 12:00 AM.
- Fraternity members cannot have any form of communication with a potential new member until that person signs a bid or the day has ended.
- Fraternities are individually responsible for distributing bids in whatever manner they choose.
- Come sign your bid in SUB Georgian Room A between 12 PM and 4 PM. An email will be sent out later with details about the process.
- Potential new members are not required to sign a bid with any fraternity; it is entirely their choice.
- If you do not sign a bid at this time, you may inquire with chapters about the opportunity to accept a bid at a later date.


Phi Kappa Tau is a tight-knit group. As a fraternity, we love doing events to serve our community and other philanthropies.




